



INFORMATION REGARDING DILATING EYE DROPS

YES NO Dilating drops are used to dilate or enlarge the pupils of the eye to allow the eye doctor to get a better view of the inside of your eye.

Dilating drops frequently blur vision for a length of time which varies from person to person and may make bright lights bothersome. It is not possible for your eye doctor to predict how much your vision will be affected. Because driving may be difficult immediately after an examination, it's best if you make arrangements not to drive yourself.

Adverse reaction, such as acute angle-closure glaucoma, may be triggered from the dilating drops. This is extremely rare and treatable with immediate medical attention. If you have any known allergies to dilating drops or if you are pregnant, please advise us.

INFORMATION REGARDING EYE GLASS PRESCRIPTIONS

YES NO An Eye Glass Prescription is determined by a test that is called a Refraction.

A refraction is the only way your doctor can tell if there was a change in your prescription for glasses or contact lenses which will improve your vision. If your vision is decreased your doctor must have the results of the refraction to determine if the cause is due to a prescription change or if your vision may be decreased due to an eye disease.

Most Medical insurances will not cover the refraction charge of \$46.00. If a refraction is performed, \$46.00 is expected when you check out for your appointment.
